SCOTTISH OPERA'S NEW SEASON OPENS WITH THE MARRIAGE OF FIGARO

Scottish Opera's hit production of Mozart's *The Marriage of Figaro*, directed by the great British baritone **Sir Thomas Allen**, opens the Company's 16/17 season in October at Theatre Royal Glasgow.

A revival of its 2010 production, *The Marriage of Figaro* then goes to Aberdeen, Inverness and Edinburgh, and in January 2017 will travel to the Empire Theatre in Liverpool. Beautiful period designs by **Simon Higlett** provide the backdrop to this timeless comedy of social revolution and change.

The role of Figaro is performed by former Scottish Opera Emerging Artist **Ben McAteer** (*The Devil Inside* 2016), who is joined by Jette Parker Young Artists **Samuel Dale Johnson** as Count Almaviva, and **Anna Devin** (*Don Giovanni* 2013) as Susanna. Scottish talents **Donald Maxwell**, **Eleanor Dennis** and **Marie McLaughlin** play Antonio, Countess Almaviva, and Marcellina,

respectively. Conductors **Tobias Ringborg** (*Il trovatore* 2015) and **Timothy Burke** share conducting duties.

Director **Sir Thomas Allen** said of the production: 'The greatest works of art stand examination again and again. There's always something new to find in layer after layer; a road that will take you to new aspects of the story.'

Ben McAteer added: 'I'm thrilled to be returning to Scottish Opera this season and to be taking on the role of Figaro. He's cheeky, irreverent and gets most of the good tunes! Most exciting for me is the chance to work closely with **Sir Thomas Allen**. I've been a huge fan of his since I started listening to opera as a teenager, and his insight and experience is something I'm looking forward to learning from.'

The opera tells the tale of the once charming Count Almaviva, now a scheming bully who spends his days pestering the serving girls. Figaro, his head of staff, is engaged to Susanna, but Almaviva has a particular soft spot for her and is doing everything he can to delay their wedding. Figaro, Susanna and Rosina, the Count's disillusioned wife, conspire to expose his schemes but then Figaro's old foe Dr Bartolo turns up, with a revelation of his own to tell.

Audiences also have the chance to attend *The Marriage of Figaro* Unwrapped, a free one-hour taster delving further in to the show and how it was created, as well as Pre-show Talks. Those who are visually impaired can enjoy the full opera experience at Audio-described performances, which have live commentary that describes the action on stage without compromising the music.

Notes to Editors

Scottish Opera is Scotland's national opera company and the largest performing arts organisation in Scotland. It was founded by Alexander Gibson in 1962 and was inaugurated with a production of *Madama Butterfly* at the King's Theatre in Glasgow.

Notable achievements include the world premiere of James MacMillan's *Inés de Castro* at the 1996 Edinburgh International Festival and complete Ring cycles at the 2003 Edinburgh International Festival, which won the 2004 South Bank Show Award for Best Opera Production. Recent commissions include *Five:15 Operas Made in Scotland* (2008-10); *The Lady from the Sea, Clemency*, the double bill of *In the Locked Room* and *Ghost Patrol* (winner of a South Bank Sky Arts Award) which premiered at the 2012 Edinburgh International Festival and 2016's *The Devil Inside* by Stuart MacRae and Louise Welsh.

Scottish Opera is committed to bringing the widest possible range of opera, performed to the highest possible standards, to the maximum audience throughout Scotland and the UK. Each year it performs in Glasgow, Edinburgh, Aberdeen and Inverness, as well as smaller theatres, village halls and community centres throughout the country.

Scottish Opera's Education and Outreach Department was the first of its kind of any opera company in Europe. It operates an extensive programme which involves over 10,000 primary school children every year, as well as many other activities including adult learning and free *Unwrapped* taster sessions.
